As the Visitor Services Coordinator, you will be working to provide services to the general public.

Tasks and Responsibilities

- Assist visitors by directing them appropriately within the facility, provide detailed information to visitors and locals about attractions, recreation, accommodations, and a variety of products, services, and activities.
- Keep the public up-to-date using social media and our website. This includes monitoring and responding to social media enquiries, posting to social media according to a pre-determined schedule.
- Order, display and distribute tourism related brochures and print materials.
- Schedule and train volunteers for collections activities to ensure quality results and volunteer success.
- Conduct general light labour duties within the facility, such as sweeping floors, cleaning spills, sanitizing surfaces, replenishing supplies, and ensuring that the facility is properly stocked. Adapted duties are also available.
- Maintain a journal recounting the challenges and successes faced in the position that can be summarized in an end-of-summer report.
- Contribute as a member of the Agassiz-Harrison Museum & Visitor Centre team, providing assistance and support for other projects as required.
